Part 1: Chinese Civilization Introduction

All civilizations have certain characteristics. These include: (1) large population centers; (2) monumental architecture and unique art styles; (3) shared communication strategies; (4) systems for administering territories; (5) a complex division of labor; and (6) the division of people into social and economic classes. (Adapted from <u>Key Components of Civilization</u>.)

Directions:

- Review the key components of a civilization.
- Think about the novel that you read.
- Ask yourself:
 - Is there a large population center (cities) described in the novel?
 - Does the novel describe unique art and/or architecture?
 - Are there shared ways to **communicate**?
 - Does the novel describe a strong political and/or military presence?
 - Are there **different types of work** described within the novel? (farmers, artists, politicians)
 - Are there **different classes of people based on their wealth** and status described in the novel?

 - Example: farming/agriculture could be an example of division of labor/type of work (example shown in table below).
