I am pleased to share that Key School has created a liaison committee to work with a committee the Annapolis Roads leadership has indicated it is formulating. The committees will work to open communication lines between Key and Annapolis Roads during construction at the site, and going forward.

Noel Gasparin, our Director of Facilities, and Steve Ginter, our Director of Advancement, are my colleagues who have agreed to join me as members of the liaison committee.

Prior to joining Key in July 2017, Noel worked for close to thirty years at George Washington University, where he was the Director of Grounds Operations for over twenty years. A long-time resident of Hillsmere, Noel worked to help create the positive relationship that Key currently has with HSIA (Hillsmere Shores Improvement Association) and the residents of Hillsmere. I believe his experience will be extremely beneficial as we work to build a similarly positive and productive relationship with Annapolis Roads.

In addition to being a member of the senior administrative team, Steve Ginter also lives in Annapolis Roads. Given concerns that Tom Bodor shared with me about Key's understanding of the difference between living in Annapolis Roads and owning property in Annapolis Roads, Steve will bring the important perspective of a resident to our work.

I have notified Tom Bodor that we look forward to hosting a meeting as soon as the Annapolis Roads committee is created.
